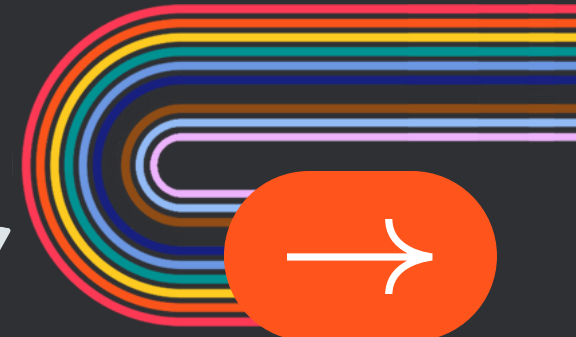

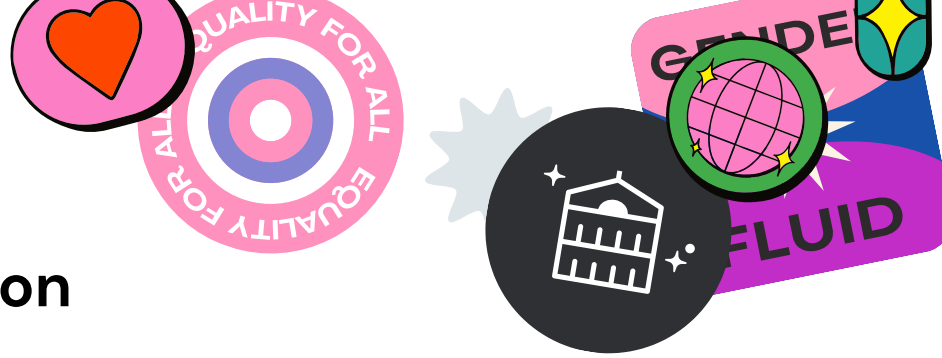

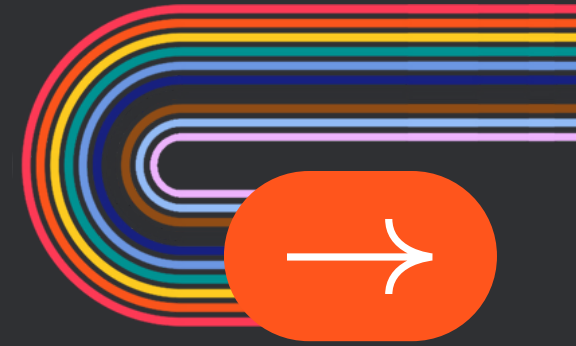

Brave Space Alliance is the first Black-led, trans-led LGBTQ+ center located on the South Side of Chicago, and designed to create and provide affirming and culturally competent services.

Founded in 1985 during the height of the AIDS crisis, **Chicago House** aims to play a critical role in eliminating new infections and getting to zero by 2030 and believes that housing is essential to ending the HIV/AIDS epidemic.
