#### Support Non-Profits

**Brave Space Alliance** is the first Black-led, trans-led LGBTQ+ center located on the South Side of Chicago, and designed to create and provide affirming and culturally competent services.

Founded in 1985 during the height of the AIDS crisis, Chicago House aims to play a critical role in eliminating new infections and getting to zero by 2030 and believes that housing is essential to ending the HIV/AIDS epidemic.


